

READMISSION APPLICANT:

Definition-

A former *degree-seeking* Texas A&M undergraduate student, who does not have a bachelor's degree and who did not officially register for the previous semester (excluding summer sessions) OR registered and withdrew before the 12th class day at Texas A&M University.

Readmission does NOT include applicants whose only previous enrollment at Texas A&M University was as a non-degree seeking student.

Documents Needed/ Required Credentials

*All materials must be received
BY THE APPLICATION DEADLINE.*

- State of Texas *Apply Texas Application* – Completed. www.applytexas.org
* Please select Readmit Undergraduate Application when applying.
- Nonrefundable **Processing Fee** \$75 as a domestic applicant. Credit Card payments may be charged a minimal non-refundable transaction fee.
- If requesting a **Fee Waiver**, must submit documentation of need from a financial aid advisor at your current school. May be uploaded using the Applicant Information System (AIS)
- **Essay** topic B is required *if you were suspended for academic reasons*. If so, briefly describe any actions you have taken to improve your academic abilities, and describe why you should be re-admitted to Texas A&M University. (Essay topics A and C are optional, but recommended.)
- **Official College Transcript(s)** from all colleges attended since last enrolled at Texas A&M University. Must be mailed in a sealed school envelope or submitted electronically* from each institution attended.

* See admissions.tamu.edu for acceptable electronic transcript providers. Faxed or emailed copies will *not* be accepted.
- If permanent resident, must submit a copy of both sides (front and back) of the permanent resident card or I-485 prior to enrollment. If application is in process, please provide copy of I-797. If under 18, a copy of the parent's permanent resident card is also required.
- If Texas resident based on SB 1528 (36-month provision), must submit the SB 1528 affidavit prior to enrollment.

All students under age 22 entering an institution of higher education (public or private) **must provide proof of bacterial meningitis vaccination** within the last 5 years. Readmits must provide current proof of immunization, prior records on file are not sufficient to meet requirement in most cases.

Admission Criteria/Conditions

Complete application files are reviewed and a decision made by the academic college.

Admission decisions are based on:

- GPR on Texas A&M University coursework;
- GPR on coursework since leaving Texas A&M University;
- desired major; and
- information presented in the application.

Transcripts from institutions attended since the last enrollment at Texas A&M University are required as follows:

2021 Spring Semester – Need transcripts through 2020 Summer Semester.

2021 Summer Semester – Need transcripts through 2020 Fall Semester.

2021 Fall Semester – Need transcripts through 2020 Fall Semester **if applying *before* June 1.**

2021 Fall Semester – Need transcripts through 2020 Spring Semester **if applying *after* June 1.**

2022 Spring Semester – Need transcripts through 2021 Summer Semester.

2022 Summer Semester – Need transcripts through 2021 Fall Semester.

Note: A 2.0 GPR on coursework in progress during the semester (excluding summer terms) immediately prior to enrollment at Texas A&M University is a condition of admission.

Additional Information

- Grades for all transferable courses are used in the computation of the GPR.

This includes :

* Failing grades, repeated courses, WF, Incomplete, etc.

* Grades reported as Incomplete are computed as Fs.

* Plus and minus grade designations are *not* used; C+ is computed as a C, B+ is computed as a B, etc.

- Credit by examination courses which are transcribed from other colleges or universities may be transferred if sequential coursework with credit is also indicated. If there is evidence that the credit by examination courses are part of the student's program of study at that institution, credit will be awarded for those courses that meet the transfer guidelines.
- A minimum of 36 semester hours of 300 and/or 400 level coursework, with a minimum of 12 of the course hours in the major, **MUST** be completed in residence at Texas A&M University to qualify for a Baccalaureate degree.
