

SUMMER TRANSIENT APPLICANT:

Definition -

An applicant with a high school diploma (with the exception of a high school concurrent enrollment participant) who wishes to take specific undergraduate coursework *for Summer only*, and does *not* wish to pursue a degree at Texas A&M University.

Please select the <u>Transient</u> Application when applying online. • Nonrefundable Processing Fee \$75 if a domestic applicant. Credit Card payments may be charged a minimal, nonrefundable transaction fee. • If requesting a Fee Waiver, must submit documentation of need from a financial aid advisor at your current school. This can be uploaded in our Applicant Information System, AIS. • Essay topic B is required – Non-degree Statement of Purpose essay. Explain why enrollment at Texas A&M University is necessary; be sure to indicate the courses that you plan to take and that you understand that admission is for the <u>summer only</u> and you will return to your original institution. • A complete, official transcript showing high school graduation or the highest and latest collegiate coursework attempted or completed. Must be mailed in a sealed school envelope or submitted electronically from the institution attended. See admissions.tamu.edu for acceptable electronic transcript providers <p>Documents required for enrollment:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If permanent resident, must submit a copy of both sides of the permanent resident card or I-485 prior to enrollment. If application is in process please provide copy of I-797. If under 18, a copy of the parent's permanent resident card is also required. • If Texas resident based on SB 1528, must submit the SB 1528 affidavit prior to enrollment. • All students under age 22 entering an institution of higher education (public or private) must provide proof of bacterial meningitis vaccination within the last 5 years.
